

FAQ

Will there be any catering on site?

A small selection of catering will be available on site. All catering units have been briefed and trained adequately to follow Government Guidelines. This includes the use of PPE equipment. Catering will either be delivered to your vehicle at a distance, or 2 metre queuing systems will be in place. Alternatively, cars can choose to bring their own selection of food and drinks to be consumed inside their vehicle during the showing. Outdoor picnics are not permitted. In the interest of safety for all, please also take all of your litter home with you rather than disposing of it on site.

Will there be any toilets on site?

A sufficient amount of toilets will be available for use during the event. These are being regularly monitored and cleaned. Please ensure you use our provided hand sanitizer stations before and after use in the toilet.

What hygiene measures are in place?

Regular announcements will be made to remind visitors to be diligent. Please make use of the sanitiser stations positioned around site, especially when using toilet and catering facilities. Please remember to keep a 2 metre distance at all times. Staff will be seen to be wearing PPE at all times.

Where is the drive in cinema located?

The film screenings will take place in Princes Park. Please enter the entrance to the park on Wartling Road which will be clearly signposted. We ask you to be patient with our marshals who will be doing their best to get you on to site and into your parking spot as smoothly and safely as possible.

Can I leave the site before the film has ended?

This is only permitted if the need to leave is essential (such as an emergency), due to the disruption this may cause for other paying customers. A marshal will need to be notified if this the case, to assist you out of the event site as safely and smoothly as possible.

Can we leave our vehicles to watch the film?

You must stay inside your vehicle at all times during the screening unless you are using the catering/toilet facilities. This rule is in place to keep in line with Government guidelines.

Can I choose where I park my car?

All space allocations are clearly marked out to ensure all vehicles have a clear view of the film. Marshals will direct you to your allocated spot. Please be advised that larger vehicles will be permitted to park towards the back of the screening to ensure the views for other vehicles are not compromised. Allocations are based on a first come, first serve basis.

What should I bring with me to the drive in?

To make the screening as comfortable as possible inside your vehicle, we advise pillows, comfy clothing and any snacks or drinks you may wish to bring.

How will I be able to hear the film?

You must ensure your car radio is in good working order to be able to hear the sound at the Drive In. We hold a radio transmission license which allows us to broadcast through FM. In order to hear the film, you will connect to the audio via FM connection. More details of the station to connect to will be advised nearer the time.

What can I do if I start to feel unwell?

Medical facilities will be available on site, please inform a member of the medical team or a marshal if you start to develop symptoms of feeling unwell during the screening.

Are pets allowed?

As a temporary measure you will not be able to bring dogs as leaving your car to stretch their legs would not be an option.

Will I get a refund if the event is cancelled?

Only in the event that we the drive in is cancelled due to poor weather conditions or safety reasons.

Is smoking/vaping permitted?

As long as this is not affecting other attendees

Are we allowed to keep our vehicles engine running during the event?

We are happy for you to run your vehicle intermittently throughout the event as long as you do not have daytime running lights.

Is there an interval?

There will not be an interval as we wouldn't like to stop the enjoyment of your screening. Please be considerate to other audience members when purchasing refreshments during the screening.
